



Model Plans to Give \$100,000 to Random People upon the Success of SupportMyMillion.com

If the website SupportMyMillion.com can generate \$1,000,000 in donations by December 24th, 2008, people passing through Times Square, New York City will get a pleasant surprise: free money.
